MINUTES FOR MEETING OF APRIL 11th

The meeting was opened by President Freund. After a discussion, the council decided henceforth to use the following method in paying bills for property damage. Notices of damage to general college property will be posted on the bulletin boards, and the person (or persons) responsible for the damage will be requested to report himself to a council member. Bills for damages in the dormitories, if those responsible for the damage remain unknown, will be apportioned among the occupants of the room or rooms where the damage occurred. The council realizes this method of assessment may be unfair in some cases, but the excessive damage of this year has cut very deeply into the council's treasury, and this method seems to be the best way to decrease the damage.

The shortage of silverware in the dining room has gotten so acute that not all the tables can be set. Please return any silverware you have in your room. To make it easier for you to return your silverware, council members will go through the dorms soon and collect it. You won't even have to remember; they'll come by and ask you for it.

The council dissolved the Vic Dance Committee, since it felt the committee serves no particular function that couldn't be performed by a club or other group that wanted to hold a Vic Dance.

John Burge and Nick Norton were appointed to the Inter-Dorm Dance Committee. Other members will be chosen later. The council agreed with Burge that the three inter-dorm dances held this year have been successful, and expressed the hope that future dances could include a greater variety of both Bryn Mawr and Haverford dorms.

Gordon Werner was appointed to see that the Haverford College handbooks are printed.

The council approved a loan of \$75, to be repaid before the end of this semester, to the Theatre-in-the-Round with permission to charge Haverford students \$1 admission at their performances.

Those men interested in serving on the Freshman Introduction Committee (formerly the Big Brother Committee) are asked to sign the adjoining sheet. The council will consider all men who sign, but signing up will not necessarily mean appointment to the Committee.

All men who would be interested in serving on a Curriculum Committee, which will discuss curriculum with faculty members, are asked to sign up. Again, the council may not appoint all those who sign.

MINUTES FOR MEETING OF APRIL 25th

At the invitation of the Students' Council Mr. Caselli attended the meeting to discuss the Student Association's financial position, the Co-op, the dining room, and the coin machines.

Mr. Caselli explained that the college is responsible for the coin machines installed by private enterprises. Damages of all kinds to coin machines on campus are Student Association responsibility.

Mr. Caselli requested that the Students' Council appoint a dining room committee which would co-operate with Mrs. Beatty and himself in a joint effort to improve the food and the dining room atmosphere.

Mr. Caselli explained that profits in the Co-op—if any—are meager. All profits are used to defray equipment costs and to improve the service. An effort will be made to lower some prices, and Club '50 will be opened (without waiter service) during Co-op hours for student use.

The Manager of the Ardmore Branch, Bell Telephone System, presented the college a \$42 bill for losses in the second floor Founders phone caused by using pennies.

The Council discussed the general situation of room rents and room distribution. An effort will be made to apply a fairer system of rents. In a subsequent meeting the Council will discuss this problem further and make a recommendation to the college administration.

At the suggestion of Bruce Hollmann, the Council discussed the possibility of moving the phones in Barclay, now that the partitions are down, so that each floor would have a phone instead of each section—North, South, and Center—having one.

MINUTES FOR MEETING OF MAY 9th

The council will make a recommendation to the administration that the Students' Association share of next year's unit fee be raised from \$15 to \$18. This increase would enable the council to avoid a serious money shortage like this year's.

Roger Good was appointed to the Campus Committee.

Since the Fund Drive Dinner will be taking place in Founders Dining Room, the student body will eat in the co-op' Tuesday night, May 15th. There will be sandwiches, fruit, and milk for everybody.

In the past few weeks forty-five books have been taken from the library without being signed out. Students are reminded that library rules come under Students' Association Regulations. All books not signed out should be returned at once.

The council felt that the small committee which this year's Honor System Committee proposed could perform some very important functions, including: 1) Speaking with members of the faculty to clarify just what is meant by individual work, especially in labs; 2) Recommending changes in the Honor System; 3) Being responsible for Freshmen signing the Honor Pledge; and 4) Writing letters over the summer to incoming Freshmen explaining the Honor System. Steve Sachs was appointed to this committee; the rest of the committee will be appointed next fall.
